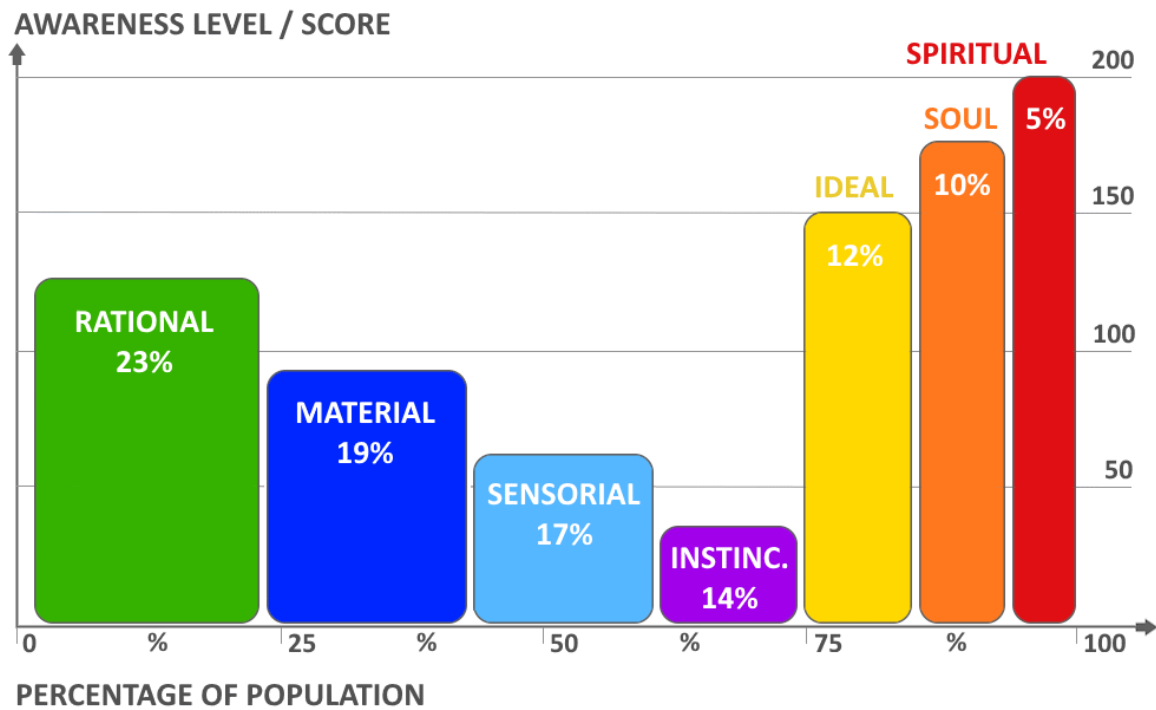
Distinctive traits: *Analysis, Comparison, Conclusion*
